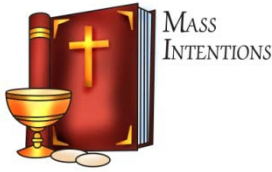

Catholic Youth Organization

Registration is due now for World Youth Day 2011 in Spain with Pope Benedict XVI. World Youth Day is a major pilgrimage in your Faith. We will journey with the Diocese on the extended Pilgrimage August 7 - 22, 2011, through Barcelona (Sagrada Familia Basilica) to Montserrat (Nearby cave of Manresa where St Ignatius wrote much of the Spiritual Exercises), Manresa (St Ignatius museum), Lourdes (Our Lady of Lourdes Grotto), Boly Mill (Birthplace of St Bernadette), San Sebastian (Beach of La Concha), Pamplona (old city Ciudad Antigua and walk on the Camino de Santiago), Puente la Reina, Segovia (Cathedral), and finally Madrid for the main World Youth Days with Pope Benedict XVI. Cost estimate is \$3,000. Non-refundable deposit of \$300 can still be sent to the parish office. The second non-refundable payment of \$200 is due to the parish office by August 9th. After this there might only be a waiting list. Pilgrims must be 16 before August 7, 2011 (14 if a parent is Chaperone). First Reading: 1 Kings 19: 16b, 19-21

Elijah the prophet followed God's instruction to appoint a man named Elisha as his successor. Elijah threw his cloak over Elisha, who went and said good-bye to his family, then followed Elijah without question.

Second Reading: Galatians 5: 1, 13-18

Paul reminds us that people were freed from the old law through Christ. But he makes it clear that this freedom does not mean giving in to evil desires. Instead, we must be guided by the Spirit and most importantly love our neighbor as ourselves.

Gospel: Luke 9: 51-62

Jesus set out for Jerusalem, and passed through a town where He was not welcomed. He reprimanded His disciples for desiring vengeance against the town. One man wanted to follow Jesus when he had finished his duties at home. Jesus expressed that a man who begins a task, but constantly looks back is unfit for the reign of God.
