 Brown Scapular**

On Saturday, July 16th, the Memorial of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Fr. DeMartino will offer the catechesis and investiture into the Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel after the 9 AM Mass. The Brown Scapular was given to St. Simon Stock by the Blessed Virgin Mary at the Carmelite Monastery in Aylesford, England in 1251 as a pledge of spiritual protection and as a means of the laity to participate in the spiritual merits of the Carmelite Order. At the conclusion of the catechesis, Fr. DeMartino will have Brown Scapulars on hand to invest all who are ready to commit to the obligations surrounding the wearing of this sacramental.
