On Saturday, October 8, 2011, our parish will participate with Bishop Loverde and many other diocesan priests and parishioners in a pilgrimage of prayer to the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, from 9:00 AM to 2:30 PM. This will be an opportunity to pray as a diocesan family. The event will be televised live on the Eternal Word Television Network (EWTN).

**Also on this day** the Knights of Columbus will host the Aquia Field Mass in the historic Brent Family Cemetery, commemorating all the faithful departed, especially the Brents, who were the first Catholic settlers in Virginia. Mass will begin at 11:00 AM. In the event of inclement weather, Mass will be celebrated at St. William of York Catholic Church. There will be a luncheon following the Mass in the parish center.

Because of these events there will be no 9:00 AM Mass, no 9:30 AM confessions, and no 3:30 PM confessions on Saturday, October 8<sup>th</sup>.

We hope to see many of you for prayer, confessions, and Mass with our priests and bishop at the pilgrimage Mass. The anticipated Mass at 5:00 PM and Spanish Mass at 7:00 PM will be celebrated, on schedule, as always.

# **World Youth Day Madrid**



Thank you to those who supported our youth through prayers, Mass intentions, and donations. Three of our high school teenagers and Seminarian David Dufresne were blessed to join the 17 day pilgrimage to the foot of the Cross. Youth from around the world carried the World Youth Day Cross to Madrid and presented it to our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI. Our pilgrimage started with Sunday Mass at St William of York Catholic Church and continued with daily Mass at

Barcelona Cathedral, Santa Cova (Holy Cave, St Ignatius of Loyola) Church in Manresa followed by a moment of prayer at the foot the Black Virgin of Montserrat with the Christ Child, Mass at the Grotto of Lourdes, followed by a bath in the waters of Lourdes, prayer time in the Chapel and at the Relics of St Bernadette and in the Basilica of the Rosary, Stations of the Cross and candlelight procession of the Holy Rosary, Mass in the Basilica of Lourdes, leisure time for a swim in the Atlantic Ocean at San Sebastian, prayer time in St James Cathedral and the Begonia Basilica (Our Lady of Begon'a - St Mary Patron of Biscay) in Bilbao, Mass in the Cathedral of Royal St Mary in Pamplona, we continued our pilgrimage on foot for 14 miles of the Camino de Santiago (Way of St James) from Pamplona over a mountain (Sierra del Perdon - Mount of Forgiveness) to Puente la Reina (Bridge of the Queen) for Mass in their 12th century Santa Maria de Eunat (St Mary of the Hundred Doors) Church, Mass in the Cathedral of Segovia, and finally to Madrid for the week of World Youth Day. In Madrid we celebrated daily Mass in St



Christopher & St Rafael Church for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, World Youth Day 2011 Opening Mass with Archbishop Varela of Madrid in

the Plaza of Cibeles Palace, Catechesis and Mass with Archbishop Cardinal Chaput of Colorado in the Madrid Arena, Catechesis and Mass with Cardinal Sean O'Malley of Boston in the Parish Church of St Anthony of four roads followed by a tour through the Prado Museum and the Welcome Ceremony for the Holy Father Pope Benedict XVI, Catechesis and Mass with Archbishop Burns of Alaska in the Madrid Arena followed by prayer time in and a tour of the Cathedral of Our Lady of Almudena and Friday evening Stations of the Cross with Pope Benedict XVI and youth from around the world adoring the Passion of Christ as depicted by life-size Paseo's along Calle de Recoletes leading to the Altar in the Plaza of Cibeles Palace, Saturday morning Mass in the Royal Basilica of St Francis the Great followed by a short pilgrimage on foot to the Cuatro Vientos (Four Winds) Airfield to await the Vigil Celebration with Pope Benedict XVI, and finally the Concluding Mass of World Youth Day in the field with Pope Benedict XVI followed by Mass in the Church of St Anthony of Florida. World Youth Day 2011 was a Grace-filled two weeks of countless Blessings. The bus rides and walks to Mass gave us personal time with priests, sisters, and seminarians from Arlington Diocese. Walking to program events and waiting gave us ample time to visit with Catholics from all over the Earth and observe the Universality of our Catholic Faith celebrated in so many different languages.
