## International Faith Festival (IFF)

Mark Your Calendars! **Sunday, September 8, 2013 from 1 PM to 7:00 PM.** Plans for the 2013 IFF are underway. For this year we have American, Hispanic, Filipino, Polish, German, Italian, Haitian and NC style BBQ food booths.

### HELP NEEDED

The IFF is an annual parish fund raising event that only happens with the help and support of the members of the parish. There is a small group who have been working diligently on this since March of this year. But help is still needed in a few critical areas. Please consider being a part of this project and stepping up to take charge of one of these areas.

**WHITE ELEPHANT** – someone is needed to take charge of this whole area. That would include set up the night before the festival, (pricing items, set up of tables and items), coordinating movement of the items from the storage shed to parish center, supervising volunteers with sales of items, and clean up after the event.

**ELECTRICIAN** – someone is needed to setup the electrical system used for the event, speakers, lights, generators, etc. (Generators are rented). The parishioner who took care of this for years has moved. Someone is needed to take his place. We are hoping there are more electricians in the parish willing to take on this task.

**SPONSORS** – still needed are donations from sponsors for door prizes, ticket prizes. (Someone to spear head this task and coordinate the prize list)

**VOLUNTEERS** – many hands are needed the day of the festival, to man booths, help in the games area, cleanup, setup, ticket sales, etc. (Also to cleanup on Monday after the festival)

## Sunday Readings

### Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c**

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

**Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18**

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

**Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20**

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.
