A Note from Father DeMartino

On the Fortnight for Freedom

The U.S. Bishops have called us once again to get informed and to get involved in the protection of our religious liberty. Father Belli and I have talked, and I have decided to commend to you what I am going to do in this Fortnight for Freedom. Both Father and I will devote all of our daily and Sunday Mass homilies to issues relating to our religious freedom and the threats against it. During the Fortnight, I will pray a rosary every day and abstain from meat every day from June 21st through July 4th, and I encourage you to follow me and join the merits of your prayer and fasting with mine. I also commend to you the following Fortnight events that you may want to join in.

■ **June 27, Diocesan Ecumenical and Interreligious Prayer Service for the Fortnight for Freedom:** 7:30 PM at the Cathedral of St. Thomas More, Arlington.

■ **July 4, Closing Mass for the Fortnight for Freedom:** July 4 at 12 PM at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington, D.C.

■ Bishop Lovede has asked that we join him in “praying for the intercession of our diocesan patron St. Thomas More— whose feast day we celebrate on June 22— for our nation’s leaders, and that we might always enjoy our First Amendment freedoms and the right to live our faith as full citizens in this great country.”

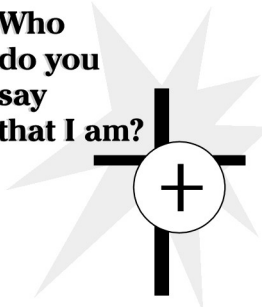

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Zechariah 12:10-11, 13:1

Zechariah describes the mourning that will occur over Jesus' crucifixion. The people of Jerusalem will mourn him as they would mourn an only son or a fallen king.

Second Reading: Galatians 3:26-29

Paul reinforces that all those who accept Christ are equal in God's eyes. Man or woman, Jew or Greek, is unimportant in God's eyes if you have true faith in Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 9:18-24

Jesus asks the disciples who they think he is. They reply that he is the Messiah. Jesus forbids them to tell this to others, and explains that first he must suffer, be put to death, and rise up on the third day. He explains to them that they also must be willing to suffer for his sake if they wish to be saved.
