Name the Saint!

My feast day is October 22nd. I was born near Cracow, Poland and was the second of two sons. I lived through World War II and it was during the war that I heard my calling from God to become a priest. Eventually I worked my way up to being elected Pope of the Catholic Church and in fact was the second-longest serving Pope. During my time as Pope, I was recognized as helping to end the Communist rule in Poland and improve relations between the Catholic Church and other world religions, such as Judaism, Islam, the Eastern Orthodox Church, and the Anglican Church. Because of my desire to make peace with other world religions, I am one of the most travelled world leaders in history after visiting 129 countries during my time as Pope. I beatified 1,340 people and canonized 483 saints. After I died the canonization waiting period was waived, making me one of the quickest canonized saints in history. I am one of the most recent saints as of last April. I am patron saint of World Youth Day. Who am I?

ANSWER: Pope St. John Paul II

Race for Seminarians

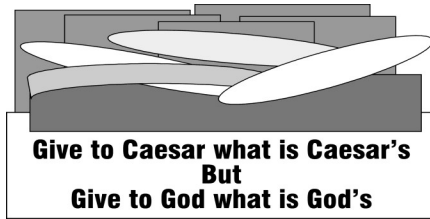
