Name the Saint!

My feast day is December13th. Little is actually known of my life, but I lived in Sicily, a small area of land off the coast of Italy. One of the most well-known stories about me is connected to my desire to devote myself completely to Jesus and stay unmarried (which was unheard of during my lifetime). As a young Christian living in a pagan society, I suffered much for my faith as people known to be Christians were killed. I was supposed to marry a man but when he found out that I would not marry him because of my devotion to Jesus, he told the Roman government and had me arrested. I was tortured in an effort to deny my faith, but I held strong and would not renounce (or give up) God. Because of my devout faith, I was killed and became a martyr. Most pictures show me holding eyes on a plate because the Romans tried to take away my sight, but God restored my sight much to the Romans' dismay. Many countries celebrate my feast day. In Sweden, the girls dress like me and wear a crown of candles on their heads as they sing and give out cookies. I am patron of the eyes and blindness. Who am I?

Advent reflection:

In the third week of Advent, we relight the first two violet candles of HOPE and PEACE, and we now also light the rose candle, symbolizing JOY. As the coming of Jesus draws near, our joy builds with the anticipation of His birth.

"The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. If we live by the Spirit, let us also be guided by the Spirit." Galatians 5:22-25

A nightly prayer for families in the third week of Advent: We joyfully praise you, O Lord, for the fulfillment of your promise of a Savior. Create us anew as we wait, and help us to see your glory as you fill our lives with your living Spirit.

The Religious Education Office has purchased 2017 Mass Missals for the new church year. We have a <u>limited</u> supply of extra missals available for any member or family in the parish. These are a good resource to use at Mass. If you would like to purchase a missal, please come to the RE office during weekly office hours (9-3) or on Sundays during classes or to the parish office during weekly office hours (9:30-4:30). The cost is \$2.00 per missal.

St. William of York Outreach

Looking back on fiscal year 2016 we are most grateful to our parish family for their continued prayers and support. Throughout this past year you have supported us steadily in many ways:

Financial support has come from many directions. We can't forget the wonderful support of the Ladies Margaret Auxiliary, the Knights of Columbus, the Seniors Group, and many other checks from parishioners quietly dropped in our mailbox. Your generosity given to the outreach via the Poor Box, regular monetary donations and bequests totaled more than \$10,000. This was a boon to our many clients. We gave out over 79% of donations/sales received to needy clients—over \$53,000. (Some funds are used to pay our utility bills, to repair and upgrade our facility and equipment and order needed supplies.)

Thrift Shop Donations allowed the shop to generate just over \$56,000 in sales this year—a historic high!

Food Donations for our pantry continued to flow in this year—from the CCD program students, our school, and the general parishioner population. No one who came to us in need of food left empty handed. The pantry volunteers issued 2,407 bags of groceries in 2016 thanks to you.

Volunteers from the parish power the Outreach. We're delighted that folks continue to step up and serve in the financial assistance office, the pantry, the thrift shop, and maintenance. The Knights have helped with special projects as well. Bless them all!

As we turn the page on 2016 we offer our deepest thanks for all that you continue to do for the St. William of York Outreach. It could never happen without you, our parish family. We wish you all a wonderful Christmas Season and many blessings in 2017.
