Name the Saint!

My feast day is July 4th. I grew up in Turin, Italy in the early 1900s in a well-to-do family. Even from a young age my devotion and piety was noticed. Though from a rich family, my father only gave me a moderate allowance. However, I always gave most if not all of my allowance to the needy. I was dedicated to works of social action, charity, prayer, and community. I even insisted on being arrested with my friends after our rally was broken up by the police. I didn't want special treatment because of my family. I died when I was 24 years old and my funeral was attended by thousands, a true testament to how many people's lives I touched. I am nicknamed "The Man of the Eight Beatitudes" by Pope John Paul II. He beatified me in May 1990. Who am I?

Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Isaiah 66:10-14c

Isaiah instructs the people of Jerusalem to rejoice, because God would restore her prosperity. The people will better understand God's power through their homeland's restoration.

Second Reading: Galatians 6:14-18

Paul describes the sign of the cross of Jesus as all that is significant. Following the old laws is unimportant. Instead, being baptized in Christ and adhering to his ideals is what matters most.

Gospel: Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

Jesus sent forth seventy-two disciples to preach his good news, telling them "the harvest is rich, but the workers few." He also gave them detailed instructions on how to act towards the people. Jesus then reminded them not to be happy because of their power over evil, but to rejoice in the salvation they would achieve.
